Rules and Regulations

NEW THIS YEAR: Curfew Enforced – Quiet time and curfew is 12:00am midnight – 5:00am.

All exhibits are closed. This includes grandstands, midway, barns and campgrounds. Anyone under the age of 18 must be accompanied by an adult during these times.

1. Entries must be filed with the fair office by 2:00 pm on July 19, 2026 **online entries are due at midnight. LATE ENTRIES WILL NOT BE ACCEPTED. WE HIGHLY RECOMMEND THAT YOU REGISTER ONLINE!**
2. **Other in person registration dates: Tuesday June 2nd and Tuesday July 7th.**
3. All exhibitors are required to purchase a week long exhibitor pass.
4. Home Arts General Rules apply.
5. Bring entries to **Building E** on **Tuesday, August 4th, 2026**, between **10:00 am and 1:00 pm**. No entries accepted outside of those times.
6. Home Art exhibits will be released on the **SUNDAY of fair week between 6 pm and 8 pm OR MONDAY AFTER FAIR (AUGUST 10th) from 11 am-1 pm, exhibits may not be removed before then.** Ribbons and exhibits will be available for pick up at these time slots only. Any exhibits that remain unclaimed after 4 pm on the Friday following the Fair will be donated or discarded.
7. Food products (excluding decorated cakes and jars) must be exhibited on an appropriate **white paper plate inside a Clear Plastic Zip-Lock bag**. No twisters or rubber bands.
 - a. Decorated cakes are to be displayed on an appropriate board.
 - b. Preservations must be sealed without paraffin and in a standard canning jar processed in a hot water bath or pressure cooker. No freezer Jam or Jelly allowed.
8. Commercial mixes allowed only if used as an ingredient in your recipe.
9. **Important:** An exhibitor may entry ONLY 3 items in any class if (1) they pay the division entry fee for each entry and (2) they use recipes for non-similar types of products for each Division.
10. Food entries NOT made by the exhibitor WILL BE DISQUALIFIED. Any two exhibits that match by two different exhibitors will be disqualified.
11. Due to health hazards, no foods will be returned, except for decorated cakes made from Styrofoam.
12. All items will be exhibited until the end of the fair.
13. All canned goods must be canned in the last 12 months.
14. **Juniors may enter the same recipe in both Open and Junior Show.**
15. The decision of the judge is final. Entries will be judged solely in competition and in comparison with each other.
16. The McHenry County Fair Association, for the safety of those attending the Fair (including the rider), prohibits the use of bicycles, scooters, skateboards, hoverboards, and similar wheeled riding items of the Fairgrounds, during the Annual Fair, including set-up and take-down.

AMOUNTS TO BE DISPLAYED (entries not following these guidelines WILL be disqualified)

Biscuits: 3

Bread/Quick Bread (Large > 6"): ¼ of loaf including end

Bread/Quick Bread (Small <6"): ½ of loaf including end

Cake (Angel or Bundt): ¼ of tube cake, without frosting

Cake (any other): 4"x4" piece or equivalent, without frosting

Cake (Layer-type): ¼ of one 8" or 9" round 2-layer cake with frosting

Coffee Cake: ¼ of ring or 4"x4" with an end included

Candies/Confections: 3 pieces, uniform size

Cookies: 3, uniform size (rolled & rolling pin/cutout;

Drop/from spoon; Pressed/cookie press (spritz);

Molded/hand formed)

Dehydrated food: Appropriate size canning jar with lid and ring for resealing (NO plastic bags), labeled with contents on top

Dinner Rolls: 3

Donuts: 3, uniform size

Muffins: 3

Preservations: One jar with lid, include ring for resealing. Must be labeled with contents on top.

Pies: 1/6 of a 9" pie (no dairy products)

Pretzels: 3, uniform size

Sweet Rolls: 3
